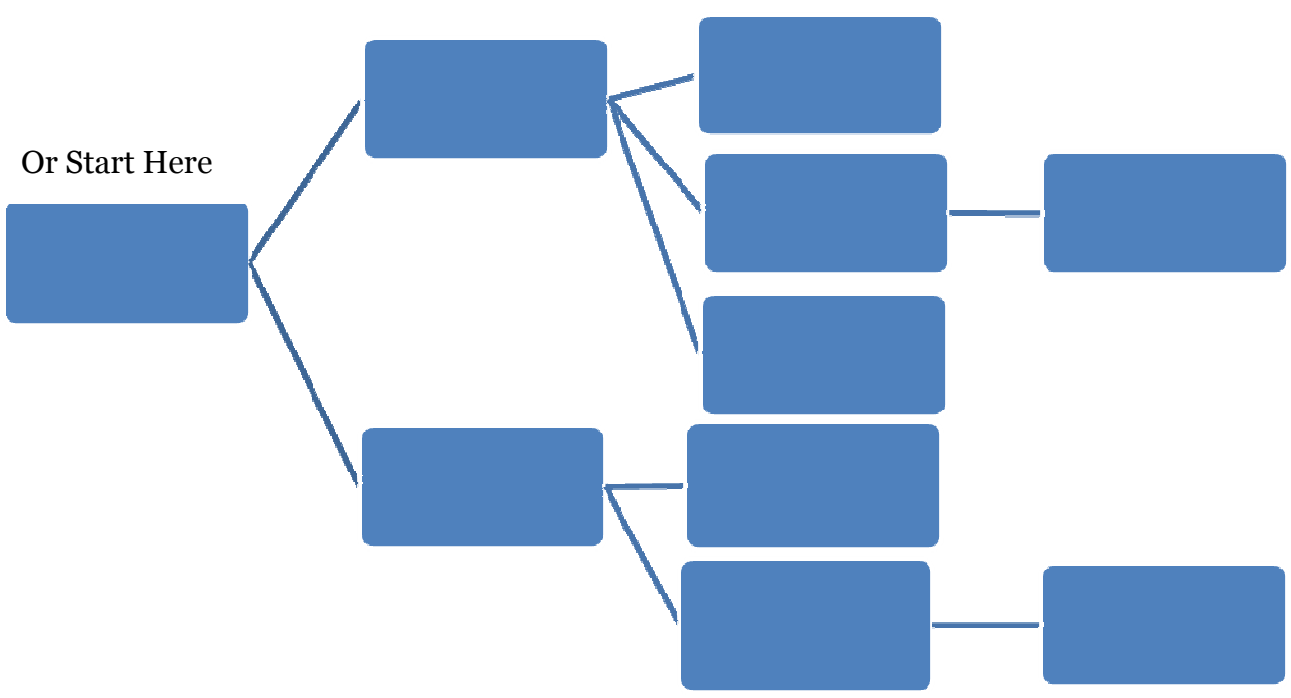
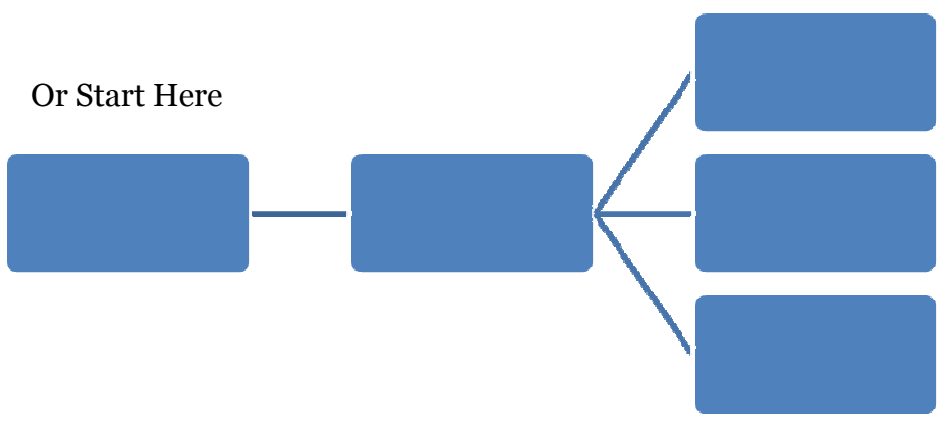
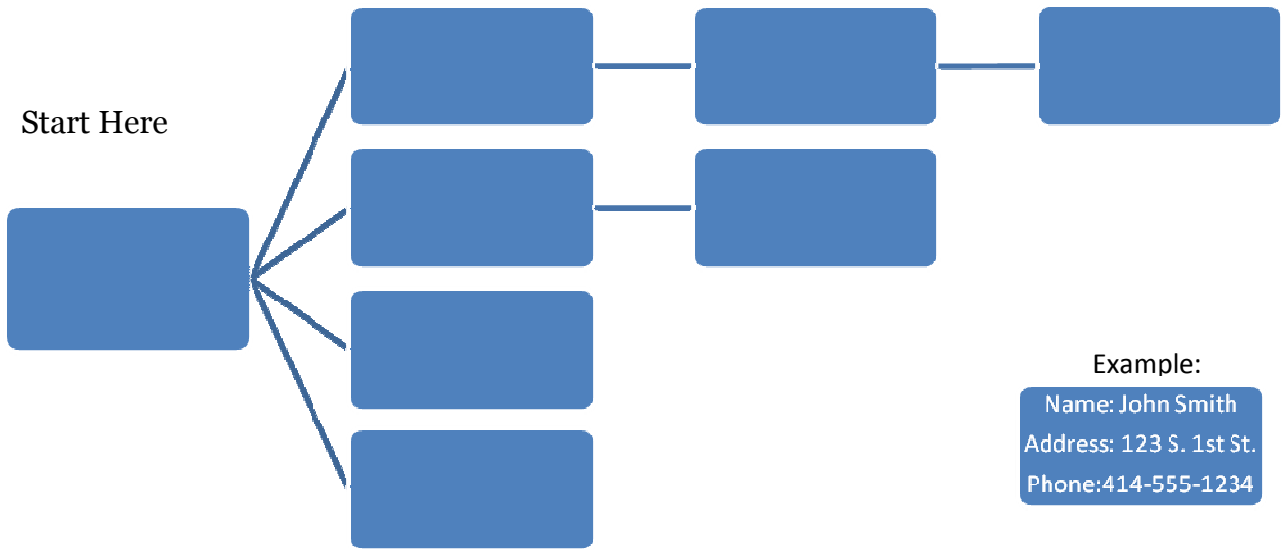

- A. I will call the police about drugs, prostitution, weapons and other illegal activity. (911 & non emergency # 933-4444)
- B. I will play an active role in the well-being of my own children by monitoring their activities; I will watch out for the safety and well being of all children in my neighborhood;
- C. I will support the presence of police in my neighborhood.
- D. I will not tolerate public displays of violence in my home or neighborhood.
- E. I will participate in neighborhood clean-ups.
- F. I will make an effort to know my neighbors, support area activities and help those who may need my assistance.
- G. I will keep my home and outside yard area clean; I will shovel snow (**City code is 24 hours**) and cut my grass (**City Code is 6 inches**) in a timely manner. **If additional trash carts are needed, call 286-8282.**

- H. I will show respect for my neighbors by restraining my dog and I will prevent excessive barking; I will use proper disposal techniques of domestic animal waste.
- I. I will notify my neighbors 24 hours prior to an event of an excessive nature (e.g. party, gathering, etc.). I will observe the Milwaukee City Curfew and I will respect the property of others.
- J. I will not allow loitering in front of my property; I will use my back yard for gatherings.
- K. I will not grill on the front porch (**this is a fire hazard**); I will not use fireworks (**It is a personal hazard and against the law**).
- L. I will not exceed neighborhood speed limits. I will not work on vehicles (unless an emergency) in alleys or on city streets; I will clean-up oil spills & dispose of oil properly.
- M. I will not block the alley or street (**allow access for all**).
- N. I will accept responsibility for myself, household members and guests.
- O. **I will not allow Dog fighting; I will report it to Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control Commission (MADACC)649-8640 stray dogs/933-4444**
- P. Failure to comply may result in the contact of the proper authorities. It will lessen the effectiveness of our **neighborhood block watch/club**.

Personal Property Identification Record

If you are a victim of a burglary it is important to know the information of any of the items stolen. Without positive identification made possible by a serial number or other identifiable information you may not be able to prove you are the rightful owner if the item is recovered. In addition, having a good record of your valuables makes it easier to report missing items to insurance companies for replacement. Use the chart below to record the description, serial numbers, and value of those items which are most likely to be stolen. Many are listed on this form. You should also take pictures especially of jewelry, silver, and antiques. Keep your property record and pictures safe along with insurance papers.

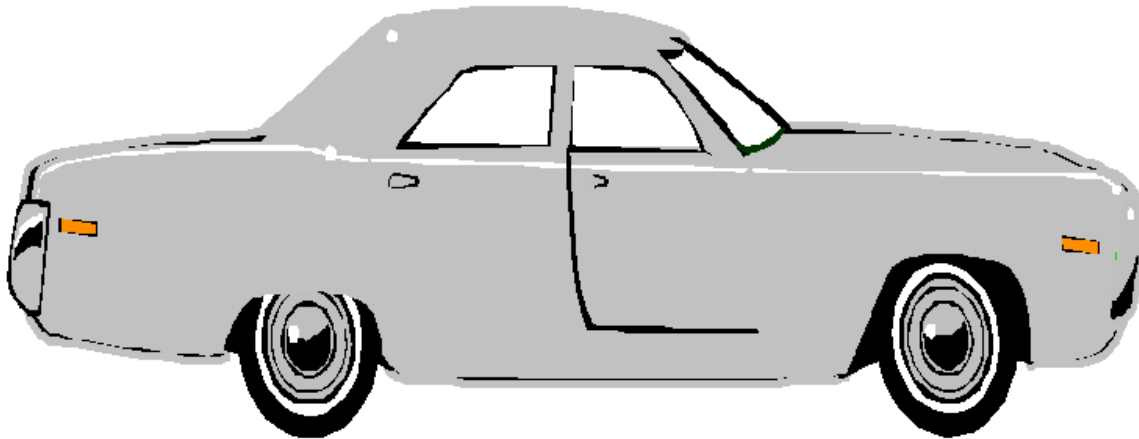

The Community Warehouse is a non-profit, faith-based provider set up to serve people in the Milwaukee community with affordable home and facility improvement materials. Their goal is to partner with foundations, individuals, builders, contractors, manufacturers and retailers to provide the resources that are needed for rebuilding Greater Milwaukee's under-served communities and as a result, significantly improve the quality of life in our neighborhoods. DPW contributes to the quality of life and economic development of Milwaukee in many ways. We are responsible for the design, maintenance, and operation of streets, sidewalks, alleys, bridges, sewers, water mains, underground conduit, telecommunications services, traffic signals, and street lighting. Community Partners has worked with DPW to promote or implement recycling initiatives, spring cleaning, safe chemical and tire disposal and neighborhood clean-ups and beautification.

Neighborhood Watch is a crime prevention program that stresses education and common sense. It teaches citizens how to help themselves by identifying and reporting suspicious activity in their neighborhoods. In addition, it provides citizens with the opportunity to make their neighborhoods safer and improve the quality of life. Neighborhood Watch groups typically focus on observation and awareness as a means of preventing crime and employ strategies that range from simply promoting social interaction and "watching out for each other" to active patrols by groups of citizens.
